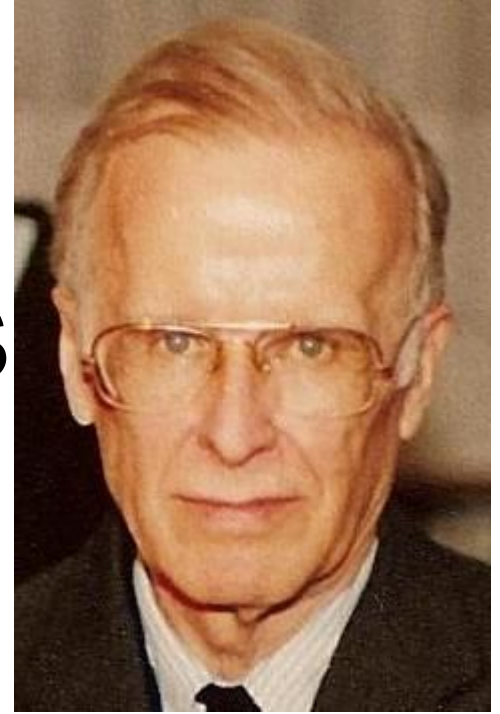




John Backus

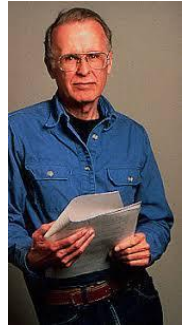

Life

- Born December 3, 1924, Philadelphia, PA
- Died March 17, 2007
- He was drafted into the U.S. Army

Mathematician Accomplishment



- The IEEE awarded Backus the W.W. McDowell Award in 1967

This was a hard award and he was great at computer technologies

- He was manager of programming research in New York City from 1954 to 1959

He was manager for 5 years and was very smart with his computer

- Backus won the National Medal of Science (1975)

This was a medal that only a few people got it was that he was very smart with science work.

Mathematical Accomplishments: Importance
