During November, the San Diego County Air Pollution Control District (APCD) provided an opportunity for students in San Diego to submit artwork for their 2020 calendar contest (artwork by Winston students can be seen at right). This contest educated the youth about the damage that air pollution has affected the planet and how they can make a difference. The artwork entered by The Winston School students demonstrated a message on how to reduce air pollution, along with their creative designs. The 13 winners will be chosen in early 2020.
